Hawks need to eat a lot of calories to power their long, rapid flight, says James Parr, director of the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and a professor of biology at New York University. They'll eat both small animals and fish, but also bugs, seeds and berries. Owls, meanwhile, are hunting out bugs, frogs, mice and other small prey, as well as fish, frogs and other small prey, say ornithologists and birders. And if you hear one of the birds you're seeing swooping about the skies this time of year, it's probably a turkey vulture, says Jeff Donaldson, a wildlife biologist with the San Diego Zoo Institute for Conservation Research in California.
