History AutoCAD Activation Code was originally released by Autodesk Inc. in 1983 as a desktop application for the Motorola 68000 microprocessor and Amiga computers running at a minimum speed of 50 MHz. Version 1 of AutoCAD supported the 68000 microprocessor, and was the first CAD application released. The Amiga version of AutoCAD was released a year later. Originally, AutoCAD was developed by a team led by three Autodesk employees: Ted Pape, Rod McGroarty, and Charles Moore. The first version of AutoCAD was developed between September 1982 and November 1982 at Autodesk's first office in San Rafael, California. The first version was based on the earlier Autocad engineering drawing application. Pape was a programmer from Rochester, New York who had worked at the Xerox Palo Alto Research Center (PARC) where he was involved in developing the Alto (an early personal computer) and the Star word-processing system. He left Xerox after the latter

company was bought by Apple Inc., and joined a new company called Microcomputer Support Inc. (MSI). In May 1982, Pape and three of his friends went to work at the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF). To fill out their work force, they recruited fellow PARC programmer Rod McGroarty who was a research associate at PARC. McGroarty was also working on the Star word processor, and had left PARC to work at a new startup called Computerized Measurements Inc. (CMI), a manufacturer of industrial computer-aided design (CAD) software. In January 1983, the four employees met the founder of CMI, Charles Moore, at a meet-up session of the Stanford University computer club. The four employees of MSI (Pape, McGroarty, and Moore, along with product manager Steve Tien) agreed to form a new company called Autodesk, named after the Autocad nameplate the four employees had earlier designed for the 68000 version of AutoCAD. The first incarnation of AutoCAD was a simple stand-alone engineering drawing program that ran on the 68000 microprocessor. Pape and McGroarty were responsible for the engineering drawing portion of

AutoCAD, while Moore focused on marketing and sales. Autodesk was initially run from a garage in Emeryville, California by the four founders of Autodesk. They recruited a programmer named Peter Kano to work
